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Ask Jacki

Q: Hi! My wedding is right around the corner, and welcome bags for my overnight guests almost slipped my mind. Do you think this is something I have to do? And what items do you suggest I include?

A: Congratulations on your upcoming wedding! Pretty exciting time, isn't it? First off, there is nothing you "have" to do for your wedding. This is a celebration of your journey as a couple, and the details of the day are up to you.

Do I think it's a nice gesture for brides to show their wedding guests who are traveling to join in their celebration some southern hospitality by saying, "We're so glad you're celebrating with us?" Of course! I love genuine, simple expressions of gratitude, and those guests who are traveling will appreciate your thoughtfulness.

There are several items to consider when putting together your welcome bag.

Decide on a **budget.** How much can you spend? Welcome bags can typically cost between \$5 - \$50 each, depending upon the items you include, and your container.

Then, decide on your **products, goodies and information.** I would definitely suggest that you include some bottled water. This can be off-the-shelf bottled water, or you can customize the bottles with your monogram on the label or a sweet welcoming thought from you and your fiancé, etc. A favorite in central Kentucky is also including Ale-8-1's in the bag. Most people outside Kentucky have never experienced tasting an Ale-8-1 (bottled in Winchester) and it's always a fun inclusion. Other beverage options include:

If your celebration is taking place at a winery, you can always include a bottle of wine in the bag, or a wine opener from the winery.

Guests visiting Kentucky always appreciate a sample of our wonderful bourbon, whether it be the beverage itself, or something that includes it like a barbecue sauce, bourbon balls, etc.

And some edibles are always appreciated in a hotel room. Crackers, popcorn, trail mix, etc. are all good options. Blue Monday candy bars (made in Mt. Sterling by Ruth Hunt Candy) can be a delicious addition. Add some of your local favorites. And, if you need suggestions, go to www.atasteofkentucky.com and www.kentuckyproudmarket.com for local treats.







If your budget allows, you could always include some sunscreen if your ceremony and reception will be taking place outdoors, a local lip balm product, or a candle from a local artisan.

Be sure to visit your area's Visitor Center and include some maps of the area and some information on the local sights and tours. And, it's always fun to include some personal recommendations from you and your fiancé of your favorite restaurants, pubs, nightclubs, shops and places to see. (An example is the map above from MEllen Designs.)

Considering your budget and the number of items you want to include, now you need to decide on a **container**. 8x10 colored Kraft paper bags are popular, and with the handles, easy for your guests to carry to their rooms. You can get these at your local party store. Market trays with slots for carrying are fun containers. Some brides have used small farm bushel baskets and one bride we worked with used a local Farmer's Market tote. Personalize your welcome bag as much as possible. Customize a round label on front welcoming your guests. If there are weekend activities, a weekend itinerary is always helpful. And don't forget to inform the hotel staff of your guests' itinerary ... they can be very helpful in case your guests need help with directions, etc.

If only you could greet every one of your guests as they arrive in town ... but creating a welcome bag filled with personally thought-out special items just for them will make them feel right at home as soon as they get in their room!

magine receiving an invitation to join Colin Cowie in Mexico for the unveiling and launch of the Colin Cowie Wedding Collection available exclusively at all Palace Resorts in Mexico and the all-inclusive Hard Rock Hotels in Punta Cana, Vallarta, Cancun and Riviera Maya! During our time at the Moon Palace Resort in Riviera Maya, I had the honor to sit down with Colin and ask him a few questions for you lovely Kentucky brides-to-be.

KB: Why now? Why Mexico?

CC: I'll start with the last question: Why Mexico? I love the Mexican people and I love the Mexican culture. You get great food and great service: two of the most important things of the wedding. What I've found here is an incredible ability and want to serve. It allows you to be set up for success at any level.

Why now? I've spent the last twenty years creating weddings for the world's elite and this was an opportunity to share what I do with a much broader audience. Having just launched ColinCowieWeddings.com, it makes complete sense to use this as another tool to spread the message and the idea that you don't have to spend a fortune to have a stylish wedding today.

KB: What makes the Colin Cowie Wedding Collection different?

CC: We listen to the bride very carefully. I have a division of my company, three people, just dedicated to finding out what the bride wants, what she doesn't want. We study her patterns. We really have taken the bride and put her right in the epicenter of our universe and it's all about her. Five years ago she wanted a formula; she wanted to be told what to do. And I think now because of the internet and also because of the downturn in the economy, she's also forced to be a little more creative. And in the process, she's also educated herself. She also wants to make her own decisions. It's not my wedding. It's the bride's wedding and we need to take into consideration that this is a once-in-a-lifetime event for her. And she wants to be able to customize it. And she wants



to be able to make some of her own choices. We give her the ability to switch out certain fabrics and make substitutions with flowers. We listen to her.

KB: Speaking of being more innovative and creative, what are your favorite trends right now?

CC: The destination wedding is still the biggest trend. When you think about it, [you can] come to Mexico in the middle of winter and bring 100 of your favorite, or 40 of your closest, and have a great blowout for 72 hours! The idea of having a wedding at a destination, all-inclusive resort is such a smart idea. It allows you to really make a great experience for your guests. You know they're going to eat great food and the accommodations are taken care of.

KB: Are there any new trends in terms of the ceremony?

CC: One of our big trends we're starting to see, especially with evening ceremonies, is bringing in all elements of fire. I love this idea. One of the rituals we will do is the bride and groom light a unity candle together. Bridesmaids, groomsmen and guests hold a little candle with a leaf around it. Then every one of their candles is lit from the bride and groom's candle,

and the flame gets passed through the congregation. And you hold the candle in your hand while the couple repeats their vows. It's collective spiritual energy. Isn't that beautiful?

I also like the idea of the serpentine aisle, which I think is kind of fun. It's a little bit more whimsical.

KB: What are some other tips for creating the very best wedding day possible?





CC: First of all, I never use the word perfect. I don't believe in perfect at all. I leave that to my counterparts. It takes too much time to get there and it's kind of boring. I think there is great charm in embracing a few imperfections along the way. Something is going to go wrong because it's just the nature of the business. A flower might not come in or something might happen late. Let's not lose sight that it is a wedding. It's your opportunity to express to your family and friends who you are. It's an opportunity to make a statement of style. This is who we were individually; this is who we are together. So, I always direct my couples not to lose sight of that during their planning process.

KB: Are there ever any rules you like to follow when planning a wedding?

CC: I get asked this a lot; I always say, "Never a rule in a wedding." My only rule is that good taste should always prevail. As long as you're not offending someone, by all means go ahead and embrace your idea. Walk down the aisle in a lime green wedding dress with your border terrier on a floral leash to Billy Idol's *White Wedding*.



KB: Is there one word that sums up the Colin Cowie Wedding Collection?

CC: Fabulous! KB

Chic Parisian Wedding

Paris is synonymous with romance and style. From the famous flower markets, to the chic avenues and small cafes, Paris' old-world charm makes it a destination dream for weddings. And while Paris is 4,641 miles away from Kentucky, the feel is certainly not out of reach.

Decor: French style is very trendy right now, so finding accent pieces that will channel the glamour and grandeur of Paris should be fairly easily. Paris is a world of colors and almost any palette will work. Think black and white, with a pink accent for a chic, glamorous look. Pastels are perfect for re-creating the vibe of the famous flower markets dotting

the city. Bold yellows and blue certainly bring a feel of the French countryside as well, or go all white and neutrals for a very shabby chic look.

The thing I love about Parisian style, is that they can take something old and beat-up and make us see it as beautiful with a touch of elegance, thus the "shabby chic" trend that has become so popular. So bring on the antique and repurposed for centerpieces and accents. Use washbasins, silver pitchers, and unique finds to accent your tables. Find French prints like damask and anything with a Fleur-de-lis symbol to use as runners. I love the use of print on burlap, a very inexpensive material, to make a unique and one-ofa-kind accent.

Whatever styles you choose, multitudes of fragrant flowers are a must. In a traditional French wedding the bride carries fragrant flowers and the use of flowers all over are a very important part of the wedding. The national flower of France is the Stylized Lily, but other common flowers are Iris Flowers, Rosemary Bush, Multicolored Roses, Sunflowers, Daffodils and Castile.

Food: Cheese and wine are a major part of the French cuisine and are perfect to start off cocktail hour (make sure to choose several French wines). Old French custom

calls for the bride and groom to drink their reception toasts from an engraved, two-handled cup called the "coupe de mariage." For light fare also have croissants, French bread, Brie, apples, grapes and baskets of baguettes to accent the table. If you're willing to take a risk, try serving your guests Escargot, a Parisian favorite. For dinner, I'll defer to a la lucie's menu, a quaint French restaurant in downtown Lexington. They offer mouth-watering dishes like Apple Pork Tenderloin and Buttermilk Fried Quail.

Venue: The Luxembourg Gardens may not be a possibility, but there are certainly a number of venues that can transform your wedding into another world. An elegant ballroom can bring the elegance and glamour, while a chateaux or historic mansion will channel the beauty of the French countryside. Having a smaller wedding, find a small patio with wrought iron furniture or cozy restaurant to recreate the scene of a quaint French café.

Traditions: To complete the perfect French theme bring in a few wedding traditions. The tradition of wearing a white wedding dress began in France, as white is a sign of love, purity and innocence. The couple will stand beneath a silk canopy surrounded by incense and fragrant flowers, which are thought to ward off evil spirits. Rather than cutting the cake, try kissing over the cake. In the middle ages, wedding guests would bring small cakes and pile them as high as possible in the center of the table. The newlyweds would then kiss over the stack of cakes trying to avoid knocking them over. If they were successful it meant they would have a lifetime of prosperity.

Tropical Caribbean Wedding

If Paris is known for style and romance, the Caribbean is certainly known for its fun-loving, laid-back atmosphere. Full of colors, music and culture, the Caribbean is paradise that would make any wedding a great time. If you can't make it to the Islands, bring the Islands to Kentucky.

Décor: Caribbean style can vary from tranquil colors inspired by the calming sea or bright hues found in tropical gardens. If you are looking for a more peaceful effect, think light turquoise and soft pink. If you want to really bring the



festive Caribbean atmosphere, look to more vibrant colors like yellow, orange, green and bright blues.

Tropical islands are known for their lush plant life, which bring beautiful colors and aromas to any setting. Include flowers like orchids, plumeria, jasmine, bougainvillea, and hibiscus in centerpieces and decorations for a truly tropical feel.

Channel the Caribbean's relaxed Island culture with a laidback, summer style. Hang hammocks or hammock chairs for additional seating; use tiki torches for lighting and to ward off any pesky insects. Incorporate shells and driftwood into centerpieces and accent pieces and hang string lights, like those found at Target, around the dance floor for a romantic vibe. Make the dress a bit more relaxed, perhaps linen suits for the groom and groomsmen and flowers in the bridal party's hair. **Food:** Food from location-to-location varies, with Caribbean countries all touting unique national dishes, which they are very proud of. But no matter which island you find yourself inspired by, you are sure to find staples like coconut shrimp, plantains, jerk chicken, beans and rice and a lot of fresh, tropical fruits. The food at a typical island reception features curried goat and spicy jerk chicken.

Really bring out the lush tropics in signature cocktails that use Caribbean fruits, like a Bahama Mama or Pina Colada. Check out Lexington's Atomic Café to get a taste of Jamaican fare or Louisville's Havana Rumba for a delicious Cuban menu.

Venue: Bringing the beach to Kentucky may prove a little difficult, but you are in the right state for finding a lush, green environment. There are many botanical gardens and parks that can certainly have the feel of the rainforest with the right touch of color and exotic flowers. Also, consider using a venue with a pool or hosting your reception at a Caribbean-themed restaurant.

Traditions: Many of the traditions found in the islands are borrowed from the U.S., but some would really take your guests by surprise. In Brazil, it's mandatory for the groom to tame an unbridled donkey, demonstrating his valor and manliness. And in Puerto Rico, it's customary for a doll version of the bride to be placed at the head of the receiving table. Caribbean weddings usually forego a best man and often times the bride is escorted by her brother, mother and father. Receptions will go on all night (may want to run this by your venue) and many toasts are made throughout the reception to the bride and groom.

The "Black Cake" is a tradition passed down through generations, usually replacing the wedding cake. The tradition calls for a "Black Cake", with the recipe handed down from the mother to the daughter. Basic ingredients include flour, brown sugar, butter, glazed cherries, raisins, prunes, currants and eggs. It is served with a hot rum sauce.

Festive in the Far East

If you are looking for weddings and customs unlike anything you have ever seen before, then the opposite side of the world is exactly the place to start your search. Countries like China, Japan and India are known for throwing extravagant and beautiful ceremonies, some which last weeks at a time.

Décor: Color is very important in many Asian countries. And while, on this end of the world, white tends to be the color of choice for brides, in Japan the color purple represents love and many brides lean towards beautifully colored silk kimonos. In China, red represents prosperity, love and joy and is used in a varied number of ways in a traditional Chinese Wedding. Red also plays a significant role in Indian weddings, and many times the bride will dawn a bright red gown.

Simple centerpieces and floral arrangements that incorporate cherry blossom branches or lanterns will bring a feeling of tranquility. Incorporate flowers native to Asian countries like cherry blossoms, orchids, hibiscus and Waling-waling in arrangements.

Chinese lanterns are a great, and inexpensive, addition to any wedding and will particularly bring out an Eastern vibe. They look beautiful during the day and night time, and provide extra lighting when the sun goes down. Also incorporate simple decorations like parasols and fans. Customized parasols are a particularly cute accent and are great for photos.



Fireworks are a great way to end the evening and very common at Chinese weddings.

Food: Food largely varies from country to country and culture to culture. The Chinese wedding feast is abundant with foods symbolizing long life and prosperity. The main course will commonly feature fowl, like duck or geese – often Peking duck is served since it is a red dish.

In Japan, food also holds symbolic meaning and foods associated with happiness and peace will be eaten during a wedding. Some traditional wedding dishes include Sekihan (a red azuki beans rice), Kombu or Kelp, Kazundo (herring roe), Datemaki (a rolled omelet), Japanese sushi cakes and the traditional sweet Daifuku. Many of the dishes may be hard to provide in the area, but staples like Sushi and Peking duck can be acquired through many caterers or local restaurants.

Venue: If you can locate a garden with Cherry blossoms or plants native to Asia this would be ideal for an Asian-inspired wedding. Or find a venue that incorporates bold reds and beautiful Asian accents, perhaps an authentic restaurant.

Traditions: The wish lantern is a tradition widely used in celebrations and festivals throughout Asia and has become increasingly trendy in North American weddings. These lanterns are the equivalent of mini hot air balloons, and tradition calls for guests to make a wish for the future when releasing theirs into the sky. 



Secrets to Packing for the Perfect Honeymoon

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It won't be too long before you are embarking on your honeymoon...hopefully to the destination of your dreams. The view will be breathtaking and the ocean crystal clear, the cocktails full of fruit and you'll finally have some peace and quiet with the one you love. But nothing can spoil a beautiful honeymoon like packing all the wrong things, having to use all your spending money on baggage fees and spending your entire honeymoon hunting down the only convenient store on the island. So, here are a few tips that will help to make sure you pack for the perfect trip.

Tip 1 - What will you be doing?

Make a list of all the things you plan to do while on your honeymoon. Do you want to go dancing, or whitewater rafting? Do you want to spend time visiting historical sites or swimming with dolphins? If you have specific locations you plan to visit, check their websites and see if there are any regulations on clothing. For instance, many of the beautiful cathedrals in Europe, including the Vatican, require that women wear skirts or dresses and have their shoulders covered before entering. To go whitewater rafting or hiking, you are usually required to wear specific kinds of shoes, like water shoes. If you want to go dancing at a nightclub or eat at a fancy restaurant, see if there is a dress code required. Make sure you don't have to sit on the sidelines even once.

${\rm Tip}\ 2$ - How long will you be gone?

The general rule of thumb is, for trips less than one week pack one shirt per day, one layering jacket or sweater, one bottom per every two days, no more than two pairs of shoes and underwear for every day. Go ahead and toss the shoe rule right out the window, but shoes do take up a good deal of space so don't go overboard. My suggestion is to pick a few key pairs that will go with everything and get rid of redundancies (like three pairs of black wedges). I would also suggest you add a couple of extra shirts and underwear, seasonal items like bathing suits and of course, the lingerie...it is your honeymoon!

Tip 3 - To roll or fold?

There are a multitude of different methods for effectively packing your suitcase, some save space, some decrease wrinkles and some are just easy (the pile and sit on the bag method). Use a mixture of folding and rolling to optimize space, but have clothes looking nice on arrival. Folding clothes is the most traditional way of packing and recommended for clothing that wrinkles easily. Fold along natural creases and seams for the least amount of wrinkles. This method is good for shirts, pants, dresses and larger items. Rolling clothes allows for much tighter packing but generally creates a ton of wrinkles. This is a good method to use for smaller items like underwear and bathing suits, as well as materials that don't wrinkle easily. At the end of your trip, roll all your clothes to create more space for souvenirs.

Tip 4 - Do your homework

First thing you'll want to do is check the weather for the location where you'll stay. You may have gotten those rooms 75% off because it's monsoon season. Check and double-check what to expect. Pack what makes sense and limit the "just in case" clothes, you don't need your earmuffs if you are going to Bermuda.

Tip 5 - Call ahead

Check with the hotel, cruise ship, bed and breakfast, or wherever it is you might be venturing off to and find out what will already be available to you. Most hotels will provide a hair dryer, shampoos and conditioners, and maybe even beach towels, sunscreen, bathrobes and slippers. The less you have to pack, the more you can take back.

${\rm Tip}\ 6\,$ - Make a list and check it twice

What are the items you can absolutely not leave behind? Make a special list for these and check it again before you leave for the airport. This list should include any prescription medications (make sure you have enough to last your entire trip), passports or travel documents, cash and credit cards, and anything else that may be irreplaceable or could stop your entire trip all together.

$\operatorname{Tip} 7$ - What not to bring


Consider where you are going and what you may want to leave behind. If you are traveling to a destination that has high poverty rates or major cities with potential pick pockets, you may want to consider leaving flashy and expensive accessories behind. Also, if you will be taking on some crazy adventures, leave jewelry behind. My husband lost his wedding ring whitewater rafting on the first day of our honeymoon. Don't bring anything that's not replaceable and even though you're so excited to be married, consider leaving those wedding bands behind. Most men are not used to wearing rings and will take them off and fidget with them constantly.

Tip 8 - Make weigh-in

Airlines have specific regulations around the size and weight of baggage. Fees for overweight or irregular sized baggage are usually around \$100 to \$200, so you definitely want to make weigh-in. Most airlines require checked baggage to be 50 pounds or less and a total of 62 inches (length+width+height). Regulations are a little more flexible for first class and business class flyers. You can have two carry-on items and that includes your purse. These items cannot exceed 22"x14"x9" and must fit easily into standard overhead compartments.

${ m Tip}~9\,$ - Pack for an amazing time

Remember you are with the person who loved you enough to marry you after you went way over budget on linens and flowers, acted erratic about the seating chart and insisted on you both visiting every venue within 100 miles. It doesn't matter what you wear, you will look amazing to each other and that's all that matters. So just worry about making sure you have the items you need to have the best time of your life.



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Travel Checklist

Your destination and plans will largely determine many of the items you need. Be sure to take all the variables into consideration when planning, like weather, what activities you plan to partake in and places you intend to visit. Below are some absolute MUSTS to get your packing started.

Travel documents – Are you going out of the country? Be sure to have your passport, which can take up to six weeks to arrive after you submit your application (so order it well in advance). Some countries, like Brazil and India, require Visas for American tourists as well, review the travel website for your destination well in advance so you can make arrangements. No matter where you are flying, though, you will need a government issued photo identification, like a driver's license.

Copies of all of the above – Make multiple copies of all of your documents and keep them separate from originals. In case a bag should go missing, at least you have somewhere to start. Also, store all the copies in a safe place online that can be accessed from anywhere.

Itinerary and travel information – Have telephone numbers and addresses of all destinations at which you will be staying. If you are traveling abroad you will need to enter this information on the landing card before entering the country. Also, leave your itinerary behind with family or friends in case of emergency.


Multiple forms of payment – Banking systems abroad can sometimes be a little less reliable. I've had my run-in with a hungry ATM in Barcelona. It ate my debit card upon arrival and threatened to ruin a two-week vacation since I didn't bring any other currency. So be sure to take plenty of options: credit card, debit card, local currency, at least \$200 US currency, and traveler's checks if accepted at your destination. Get small bills as well as large bills, likely your first payment abroad could be a taxi ride or bellhop and you'll need something to tip with.

Prescriptions medicines – Nothing will ruin a trip like not being able to properly take care of any medical conditions. Be sure to refill any prescriptions prior to your trip so you

have enough to last you throughout. Clearly label any prescription medications when traveling abroad.

Travel insurance is never a bad idea, and while each package is different, most offer coverage for trip cancellation or interruption, medical emergencies, emergency travel, weather-related disruptions and more.

Vaccinations – Check with your physician to see if you will need any vaccines before you travel. For many countries (like South Africa) you will need to start taking Malaria pills.



Guides and more guides – Invest in a good travel guide that includes recommended sites, restaurants and maps if you are unfamiliar with your destination. Also, have a pocket language guide if you are not fluent – you'll definitely find opportunities to put it to use.

Cell phone – You may have very little service or no service where you are traveling. Consider how important is it that you have your cell phone, and remember it may be much more expensive to use overseas. If you decide to turn it off and enjoy the peace and quiet, do bring something to keep track of time and be sure to leave emergency contact information behind with family and friends. If a phone is a must, contact your service provider to inquire about international coverage or consider buying a prepaid phone and plan in the country upon arrival (it may end up being less expensive).

Cameras – Bring something to document your trip, pocket cameras and video cameras. If you'll be on the beach, bring a plastic bag or protective covering to keep the sand from ruining your equipment. Also consider buying an underwater camera

if you plan to go snorkeling or scuba diving. It's likely your memory card may fill up quickly, so be sure to bring an extra.

Stay healthy – Pack a small first aid kit. If you are traveling where the language is unfamiliar, a pharmacy can prove difficult to navigate. Also list allergies and any medical conditions on a card to keep with the first aid kit.

Battery alarm clock – This is a must if you will be traveling on the road a lot. It's great to have a trusty clock and never miss a flight or connection.

Electrical adapters for overseas locations – There is nothing worse than shorting out your hair dryer while taking down the hotel's entire electrical grid. Be sure to pack an electrical adaptor, which can be found at any Target or Wal-Mart.

Items to leave behind – Your itinerary with family or friends, copy of passport or identification, unneeded credit cards and other cards like your gym membership, expensive jewelry, and a pocket knife or anything that resembles a weapon.
